Peter McInnes Award

FOR LIBRARY SERVICES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Purpose

The Awards recognise and support excellence and innovation in Australian library services.

Criteria for nomination

- Applicant can be either a Friends of the Library or a Library Service.
- Nominations for the award may be made by an FOL group for a service or by the library service itself.
- Applicant must complete the one page Entry Form.
- Supporting material, for example: press releases, promotional materials, documentation, should be provided in support of the application.
- No material will be returned, therefore, photocopied information will be acceptable.
- Nomination should provide evidence of outcomes and success of the program or event and must have taken place during the past 12 months.

Award

Entries will be judged by a FOLA Panel of Judges, on the basis of the project, or activity, the planning, implementation, innovation, community and volunteer involvement and measurable results. Each Award consists of a prize of **\$1000**, sponsored by Bolinda Publishing and FOLA, along with a FOLA certificate.

Eric Flynn

Eric Flynn (1917-2002) was a founding member of the Friends of Kew Library in Victoria and became the first President. Eric was also influential in the formation of FOLA from the early 1980s and worked tirelessly over two decades in support of the Friends movement in this country. He served on the Library Promotion Committee of Victoria's Friends sub-committee, and edited the Friends Resource File for LPCV in 1989 and 1990. Eric joined the inaugural committee of FOLA in 1994.

This award acknowledges the outstanding contribution of Eric Flynn as President of one of the most successful FOL groups in the country – Friends of Kew Library and to the development of FOLA and Friends throughout Australia.

The Award recognizes the outstanding contribution of its immediate Past President Peter McInnes to FOLA, and to the Friends of the Baillieu Library, University of Melbourne, over a period of some 20 years. As part of FOLA's vision of Better, more accessible, libraries for all in Australia, the award aims to encourage public libraries and local government in Australia in the development of services, programs and resources for the new generations, and to recognise innovation and excellence in achievement.
